
EXODUS 1-5 Shemot

This is the assigned reading in a Jewish Lectionary.

<u>Covers</u>: Israelites' affliction in Egypt, the hiding and rescuing of the infant Moses, Moses in Midian, the calling of Moses, circumcision on the way, meeting the elders, and Moses before Pharaoh.




- The story begins with a list of Jacob's descendants who came to Egypt with him.
- The Israelites grew in number and became a threat to the Egyptians.
- The Egyptians enslaved the Israelites and forced them into hard labor.
- Pharaoh orders the killing of Israelite baby boys.



- A Levite couple gives birth to a son, Moses, and hides him from Pharaoh's decree.
- Moses is discovered by Pharaoh's daughter, who raises him as her own.
- Moses kills an Egyptian who was mistreating an Israelite and flees to Midian.
- In Midian, Moses marries Zipporah, the daughter of a priest named
 Jethro.



- God appears to Moses in a burning bush and calls him to lead the Israelites out of Egypt.
- God reveals His name as "I AM WHO I AM."
- Moses is given a sign to prove his authority to the Israelites.
- Moses is instructed to go to Pharaoh and demand the release of the Israelites.
- Mt Sinai
- Will revisit this episode....




- Moses raises concerns about his ability to speak effectively.
- God gives Moses miraculous signs, including turning his staff into a snake and his hand becoming leprous.
- Moses' brother Aaron is chosen as his spokesperson.
- Moses and Aaron return to Egypt with God's message.

- Similar call story to "Here I am Lord"
- We are all called by God as part of this covenant to become the Blessings for the World
- 4 Problems Moses Brings to God
 - Unworthiness
 - God's Name
 - People won't listen
 - Moses Can't speal

What "problems" do you bring to God?



- Moses and Aaron go before Pharaoh and request a three-day journey into the wilderness to worship God.
- Pharaoh refuses and increases the Israelites' workload, making their labor even more difficult.
- The Israelite foremen complain to Pharaoh, but he dismisses their concerns.
- The Israelites blame Moses and Aaron for their increased suffering.

Earlier texts in Scripture have 7 plagues and in a different order.

You can read the earlier references/versions in Deuteronomy 7:15/28:60 and Psalm 78/105.

The 3rd, 6th and 9th are added to make 3 triads. The ten plagues are also "uncreation" from Genesis, working backwards. It is highly ordered and poetic displaying God's Power.






10 Plagues

First set -(Aaron Staff) Show Power (repeatable)

Second set-**God Directly Works** Show YHWH as a source of power (unrepeatable)

Third Set-Moses Hand No more Egyptian Priest (unclean) Show YHWH as unmatched in power




EXODUS 7 Part 2


Plague One: Nile River Water into Blood


- Fish in the river die
- Rive stinks
- People can't drink from it
- Blood in other vessels of water as well
- The Nile, as the lifeline of Egypt, was considered a deity controlled by Pharoah.
- Call back to the blood of the Israelite boys who were killed in the river.
- Shows Yahweh's power of nature and spiritual realities.

EXODUS 8 Part 1

Plague Two: Frogs in the Land

- FROGS EVERYWHERE
- Affects Pharoah, his officials and his people.
- Pharoah relents and says he will let the Hebrews go worship, so it stops but he changes his mind.
- Pharoah wants it to stop tomorrow.
- This is an undoing of the first act of Creation in Genesis 1 when God separates the waters and the land




EXODUS 8 Part 2

Plague Three: Gnats from Dust

- GNATS EVERYWHERE
- Aaron strikes the dust and it turns into gnats....they go everywhere
- The priest cannot repeat this task and acknowledge YHWH
- This is an undoing of the final act of creation when God makes humans out of dust. How the dust turns to gnats and covers humans representing death.
- God is "giving over" creation to the chaos.






EXODUS 8 Part 3

Plague Four: Flies

- Flies EVERYWHERE
- This time YHWH acts alone in causing the plague
- · Doesn't affect Hebrews for the first time
- Moses prays for it to stop when Pharoah lets them go...but he won't let the people leave Egypt to make sacrifices

 Yet again, an undoing of creation in the mandate to fill the earth. Now flies fill the earth

EXODUS 9 Part 1


Plague Five: Livestock

- Livestock die of the Egyptians
- Again, this was caused by YHWH alone
- Not Hebrew
- Same patterns...
- Livestock affects transportation and the economy as well as the food supply
- Plague has a one day gap "tomorrow" ready for repentence
- Repeats language in Genesis 1-2 with creation

EXODUS 9 Part 2

Plague six: Boils


- The first one to affect people directly
- Take dust from "furnace of affliction" and scatter it in the air
- Makes ALL EGYPT ceremonially unclean (therefore the priest can't be in the presence of Pharoah anymore nor perform rituals)
- God HARDENS Pharoah's heart
- Says this is given so he will know YHWH
- A further undoing of God's good creation


EXODUS 9 Part 3


Plague seven: hail.

- God warns Pharoah of this plague since it includes death and gives them a way out. Some listen to YWHW
- Thunder and hail kill all who it hits
- Pharoah admits his "sin" and Moses stops the plague
- Pharoah yet again won't them go after saying he would
- The plants killed were for clothes and potions NOT food. It disrupted life but didn't devastate the population










The plagues are actually about Yahweh's display of power and mercy to the Egyptians by working slowly and showing power with caution and giving space for repentance.


