
Chapter 12: Calling of Abram


10th "descendant" from Adam; 5th from Noah

Abram is called from Ur/Haran (Mesopotamia)

Brings Lot (cousin-nephew) and Sarai (half-sister wife)...plus slaves and stuff

Calls on the name of the Lord/makes an altar in Schecem and God promises the land

Famine - Egypt - Plagues (sound familiar?)

Pharaoh, Sarai and Abram's lie.

Pharaoh gets an STD/STI

They leave Egypt

Remember this story is a chaism...

Chapter 12: First trip to Egypt...why?

Serves the "meta-narrative" as a precursor to the Exodus AND Issac-Rebecca AND the chiastic structure.

- 1. Abraham and Sarah in Egypt (Gen 12);
- 2. Abraham and Sara in the Philistine city of Gerar, with king Abimelech as the antagonist (Gen 20);
- 3. Isaac and Rebekah, again with Abimelech in Gerar (26:1–11).



Chapter 12: First trip to Egypt...why?

Evidence this was written AFTER Genesis 26 which came from the E source (came first)

12:9 "And Abram journeyed on by stages toward the Negeb (south)."

13:1 "So Abram went up from Egypt, he and his wife and all that he had and Lot with him, into the Negeb (south)."



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
Chapter 12: First trip to Egypt...why?

Connects Abram to Issac and the Exodus &

Shows Abram's lack of faith in God's protection.

Shows how the human relationship is still damaged.

Testament to God working through broken people.



Chapter 13: Abram and Lot Separate

Leave Egpyt into the Negev (south) after the famine

Abram is suddenly wealthy and his company to large (mirroring Exodus) Goes to Schecem and there came to be infighting so he lets Lot choose a land for himself

Lot settles in the "cities of the Plain" (East) near Sodom while Abram settles in the land of Canaan.

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Chapter 13: Abram and Lot Separate

Shows God already blessing Abram (he has grown to big)

Shows God's intention for humanity to spread and not accumulate (not big civilizations)

Abram/Lot mirrors Jacob/Esau with God promising a land **after** a split and chosen heir. "Zooming In"

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Chapter 13: Abram and Lot Separate

Lots "looks and sees" the land is "good"

This connects back to the Garden and later in Egpyt when the people of Israel long to go back

This is a warning of arousing desire we are prone too

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Chapter 13: Abram covenant Renewed

Just as Abram let Lot look now God calls Abram to look. Here we see God rewarding the faith of Abram.

God calls on Abram to look in all directions and promises to "give" Abram the land as far as the eye can see. God promises Abram's descendants will be as innumerable as the dust.

Builds another altar in Hebron.

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Where has Abram been?



Hebron is one of 4 "holy sites" in Islam and Judaism



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
Genesis 14 War in the Valley of Sidim


¹ In the days of Amraphel king of Shinar, Arioch king of Ellasar, Chedorlaomer king of Elam, and Tidal king of Goiim,

² these kings made war with Bera king of Sodom, Birsha king of Gomorrah, Shinab king of Admah, Shemeber king of Zeboiim, and the king of Bela (that is, Zoar).

³ And all these joined forces in the Valley of Siddim (that is, the Salt Sea). ⁴ Twelve years they had served Chedorlaomer, but in the thirteenth year they rebelled.







Chapter 14: War of the Nine Kings

Tells of Canaan's captivity "12 years they served" pointing toward the later years Israel is under Assyria/Babylonian captivity

Commentary on Abram having "allies" in the land

All of "Mesopotamia" defeats and plunders the Valley of Siddim/Cannan and then Abram single handily defeats and frees everyone. (making fun)

God's favor is still with Abram

Chapter 14: Abram Saves Lot

Here we see Abram saving Lot. The family of God sticks together and is there for one another in need.

This is also a powerful lesson about God's favor and should be up there with "David and Goliath" in how God works through the "weaker ones" as along as we stay faithful

And King Melchizedek of Salem brought out bread and wine; he was priest of God Most High (El Elyon). He blessed him and said, "Blessed be Abram by God Most High (El Elyon), maker of heaven and earth, and blessed be God Most High, who has delivered your enemies into your hand!" And Abram gave him one-tenth of everything.







Prophetic: "Word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision"

Relational: "But Abram said.....And (God) said...

Theophany: "a visible manifestation to humankind of God."














Smoking Pot and Flame were used in Mesopotamian rituals to ward off evil. Here they are used as a "theophany" for God's own self.



This is a typical covenant (called "cutting" a covenant) that ONLY God "walks" through

Genesis 15: Abram Covenant of Pieces Comment about future histroy Clearly added by the final editor/redactor.

Set off by the repetition of the sun setting

Narratively out of place

Uses words and language that "don't belong"

Heb word for "Property" ONLY found in "P" source and once in Genesis 14 "alien in the land" and "will degrade them" is only used in Exodus (written from a different source)

"400 years of slavery" copies "30 and 400 years" in Exodus

Genesis 16: Abram and Hagar/Ishmael Summary

After 10 years in the land, Sarai gives Abram Hagar as a wife.

Hagar is pregnant and flees from Sarai's wrath.

God "sees" Hagar (so she calls the place El-roi) and says name your son Ishmael (God hears)

Ishmael is born.

Genesis 16: Abram and Hagar/Ishmael

Hagar is from Egypt Hagar and maybe a "princess."

She wasn't given as a concubine but as a wife (Adam and Eve).

Christian/Jewish/Muslim views of Hagar differ.

She may have married Abram after Sarai died.



Genesis 16: Abram and Hagar/Ishmael

Hagar

This story may be the central point of the Abraham cycle (as well as the two covenants).

It paints God as merciful and one who hears the hurting.

God listens to Hagar and protects her and her son.





Abram is 99 and God renews (cuts) the covenant with him through circumcision (cutting) or they will be "cut off"

Their names are changed from Abram to Abraham (great father - great"er" father or father of many nations) and Sarai to Sarah (princess/queen)

Genesis 17: Abraham and Covenant Circumcision Summary

God promises Abraham and Sarah will have a son named Issac (he laughs).

All are circumcised and Abraham asks God to bless Ishmael which God agrees to saying he will have twelve princess.
