Let's read it...

Isaac = "Laughing"

Tensions between Hagar and Ishmael (another clue about polygamy not being best for healthy marriages)

Ishmael is again blessed and provided for by God and gets a wife from Egypt

There is LOTS of play on words with lad "bow" "laughing" seeing "hearing" and "saac = "Laughing" wives"

Tensions battshmaehread like the same Isaac and Ishmaehread like the same story in many ways with VAST parallels. Try reading this of how much God still honors and cares for those outside "THIS" covenant family.




Genesis 21: Abraham and Abimelech

They build a well called "well of seven" or "well of oath" as is a way of establishing a claim to the land







Genesis 23: Death of Sarah

First, you'll notice it is a priest account amongst mostly non-priestly

There is a lot of "courtly" back-and-forth exchanges and legal proceedings that take place.

They go to Hebron (meaning the City of Four and possibly a "Hittite" stronghold) to purchase burial grounds



Abraham and Ephron have some complex exchanges... it boils down to

Abraham WAY OVERPAYS. 400 sheckles = a King's Ransom. They didn't do him any favors.

The precise legal way this is dealt with means Abraham's family is forever entitled to the land.

This has to do with conquest and them "belonging"

I will also note there is some STRANGE language used. Abraham doesn't just buy "land" ('erets) he buys the "country" (sadeh) which again alludes to this being an apologetic for the "conquest"

Other strange language is the word possession instead of buying. "Shema" or LISTEN instead of hear.. There is an emphasis on weighing and counting and contractal language.
